Theatre Arts I (7015)

Prereq: None

Grades: 9 - 12

Credit: 1

Students will participate in problem solving and dramatic communication through ensemble acting, improvisation, pantomime, costuming, voice and diction skills, script analysis, character portrayal, safe technical skills and acquisition of appropriate theatre behavior.

Theatre Production II, III, IV (7016, 7017, 7018)

Prereq: Theatre Arts I

Grades: 10 - 12

Credit: 1

Students will apply enlarged production concepts and skills to those begun in Theatre I with emphasis on UIL One Act Play study and analysis

Art I (7000)

Prereq: None

Grades: 9 - 12

Credit: 1

Students will study the art elements of line value, texture, color form and space. They will be given a choice to apply the principles of unity, emphasis, balance, variety, movement and proportion by working in the art areas of design, drawing, painting, printmaking and sculpture.

Art II: Ceramics (7001)

Prereq: Art I

Grades: 10 - 12

Credit: 1

Introduction to ceramics with studies on hand building, wheel throwing, glaze application and decorative techniques.

Art II: Sculpture (7019)

Prereq: Art I

Grades: 10 - 12

Credit: 1

Sculpture will cover the history of both 2D and 3D work. Techniques and various materials will be used.

Art II: Drawing (7005)

Prereq: Art I

Grades: 10 - 12

Credit: 1

Introduction to drawing with studies on a variety of media, techniques, and subjects including still life, landscape, portrait and life drawings.

Art II: Painting (7004)

Prereq: Art I

Grades: 10 - 12

Credit: 1

Introduction to painting concepts and techniques with emphasis on various media such as watercolors, acrylics and pastels using different surfaces such as paper, canvas, etc.

Art III: Graphic Design (7037)

Prereq: Art II

Grades: 11 - 12

Credit: 1

Students will learn to research and then develop art and copy into printed materials using computers. The students will develop menus for restaurants, t-shirt designs, business cards, logo designs, greeting cards, and open house flyers. The students learn to meet the requirements of their clients or customers. Graphic designers use computers to produce the art but still rely on fundamental design principles to create it.
