DRUG TESTING CONSENT FORM - EXTRACURRICULAR AND PARKING

Each student in grades 7-12 participating in the drug testing program as a participant in an extracurricular activity and/or to receive driving/parking privileges on campus shall be provided with a copy of the Wall Independent School District drug testing policy FNF (Local) and the "Drug Testing Consent Form" which shall be read, signed, and dated by the student and parent or custodial guardian. Before the student is eligible to practice or participate in any extracurricular activity and/or to drive or park a vehicle on campus, this form must be on file. Student and parent consent shall be required to provide a urine sample to be tested for illegal drugs, as chosen by the random/specific selection basis.

I understand after having read the "Drug Use Testing Procedures" and the "Drug Test Consent Form" that, out of concern for my safety and health, the Wall Independent School District enforces the rules applying to the use of illegal drugs. I realize that the personal decisions I make daily in regard to the use of illegal drugs may affect my health and well-being as well as the possible endangerment of those around me and reflect upon any organization with which I am associated. If I choose to violate school policy regarding the use of illegal drugs, I understand that I will be subject to the restrictions of my participation in extracurricular activities and/or driving and parking on campus as outlined in the policy.

Extracurricular Drug Testing Policy

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY DRUG TESTING	Wall ISD encourages students to participate in school-sponsored extracurricular activities, but believes the opportunity to participate is a privilege offered to eligible students on an equal opportunity basis. The use of drugs by students participating in extracurricular activities presents a hazard to the health, safety, and welfare of the student participant.
RATIONALE	<p>Wall ISD believes drug testing student participants in school-sponsored extracurricular activities serves the important purpose of detecting and preventing illegal drug use among students. Furthermore, implementing this policy shall serve the following objectives:.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. To provide a deterrent to the use of illegal drugs and alcohol by students participating in extracurricular activities;2. To give students a valid reason to resist peer pressure to use illegal drugs and alcohol;3. To prevent injury, illness, and harm as a result of the use of the illegal drugs and alcohol;4. To maintain a school environment free of drug and alcohol use and its effects; and5. To educate students as to the serious physical, mental, and emotional harm caused by the use of illegal drugs and alcohol. <p>“School-sponsored extracurricular activity” shall mean, without limitation, all 7th – 12th grade interscholastic athletics, cheerleading, academic UIL, special interest clubs and organizations, groups that perform musical performances_or dramatic productions, student government, and any other activity or group that participates in contests, competitions, or community service projects on behalf of or as a representative of the District.</p>
DRIVING & PARKING	Driving and parking on campus by Wall ISD students is a privilege and not a right. The privilege of driving and parking on campus_is considered similar to the privilege of participating in extracurricular activities and implicates its own safety concerns for other students and staff members. Therefore, the district has chosen to include students who drive to school and park on campus in the requirements of the random drug testing policy adopted by the Board. If a student refuses to be tested, he or she will not be allowed to drive or park on campus. .
REQUIRED TESTING	To be eligible to participate in any school-sponsored extracurricular activity, or to be eligible for parking privileges, a secondary student

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Tests may also be run for synthetic marijuana (commonly known as "Spice", "K2", and possibly other names) and other over-the-counter substances that may cause impairment of physical and mental faculties.

Prior to each testing and before students have been selected to be tested, the District shall inform the drug-testing provider of the specific panels of substances to be included in that test. A percentage of student participants shall be selected on a random or specific basis.

Samples shall be taken under conditions that are no more intrusive to students than the conditions experienced in a public restroom. All aspects of the drug/alcohol use testing program shall be conducted in a manner that shall safeguard the personal and privacy rights of students to the maximum degree possible.

A staff member shall be designated to accompany the student to a restroom or other private area where the urine sample is to be produced under the supervision of a designated health care professional. The monitor(s) shall not observe the student while the sample is being produced, but shall remain within hearing distance in order to guard against tampered samples and to ensure an accurate chain of custody of the sample.

If at any time during the sampling procedure, a monitor has reason to believe that a student is tampering with the sample, it shall be determined if a new sample should be obtained.

The principal or designee, in cooperation with the selected drug-testing provider, shall develop administrative regulations for collection and testing.

Any student who refuses to be tested or who tampers with, or assists others in tampering with, any sample shall be removed from all extracurricular activities and/or have parking privileges taken away for the period of time specified in the "Sanctions" section of this policy. Such a violation shall be counted as a positive result.

TESTING
SCHEDULE

Random tests shall also be conducted and may occur at any time. Students shall not be notified in advance of any drug test. If a student is in school and fails to report for testing at the appointed time, he or she shall be removed from all extracurricular activities and/or will have parking privileges taken away for the period of time specified in the "Sanctions" section of this policy. Failure to report for testing shall be counted as a positive result.

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- d. For students who drive and/or park on campus, parking privileges will be suspended for a period of one week.
 - e. The participant shall also be required to satisfactorily complete 4 hours of drug counseling from a qualified drug treatment program or counseling entity. Financial provisions can be made to pay for required counseling for economically disadvantaged students.
 2. After the second positive test result, the participant shall be suspended from performing in competitions and other organized activities for a pre-determined time described as follows:
 - a. For activities that have primarily one competition per week, the participant shall be suspended for a **minimum** of two games. The suspension shall pertain to football, cross country, golf, track, and tennis.
 - b. For activities that have primarily two competitions per week, the participant shall be suspended for a **minimum** of four games. The suspension shall pertain to volleyball, basketball, baseball, and softball. A tournament will count as one game.
 - c. For non-athletic activities, the length of the suspension shall be determined by the principal and the sponsor of those activities.
 - d. For students who drive and/or park on campus, parking privileges shall be suspended for a period of two weeks.
 - e. The participant or driver shall also be required to satisfactorily complete 8 hours of drug counseling from a qualified drug treatment program or counseling entity. Financial provisions can be made to pay for required counseling for economically disadvantaged students.
 3. After the third positive test result, the participant shall be permanently removed from all extracurricular activities for at least one calendar year. For students who drive and/or park on campus, the student's parking privileges will be revoked for at least one calendar year.

Test results shall be cumulative from grade 7 through grade 12.

During the period of sanctions, the student shall be permitted to continue full participation in practices or rehearsals, except for the period following a third positive result. .
